UK BCR Summary (Binding Corporate Rules for Processors)

Fiserv Inc. has approved binding corporate rules for processors (“EU BCR-P”), which are an internationally recognized standard providing adequate protection of personal data in multinational companies. The EU BCR-P were reviewed and approved by data protection authorities across Europe with the lead authority being in Ireland.

Fiserv has appointed FDR Limited LLC, with its address at Janus House Endeavour Drive, Basildon, SS14 3WF, England as its Lead UK BCR Member and has entered into the UK BCR Addendum to the approved EU BCR-P. The UK BCR Addendum is a formal legal mechanism which extends the scope of the EU BCR-P to include transfers of personal data from the UK. Together, the EU BCR-P and the UK BCR Addendum form Fiserv’s UK BCR-P (“UK BCR-P”). The purpose of this UK BCR-P summary is to provide information to individuals whose personal data is transferred under the UK BCR-P so that they know how their information is processed, what rights they have under the UK BCR-P and how to enforce them.

Fiserv has nominated FDR Limited, LLC as the Lead UK BCR Member to whom it delegates data protection responsibilities for the purposes of its UK BCR-Ps. These responsibilities include accepting liability for breaches of these UK BCRs by Fiserv entities outside of the UK and taking any action necessary to remedy such breaches.</p>
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<p>Description of data transfers covered by Fiserv's UK BCR-P</p>	<p>The data transfers covered by Fiserv's UK BCR-P with respect to personal data that is subject to UK data protection law ("UK personal data") are the same as the transfers described in Schedule 1, Annex B of Fiserv's EU BCR-P.</p> <p>In summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The UK BCR-Ps apply to all Fiserv companies that have entered into the UK BCR Addendum and agreed to be bound by the UK BCR-Ps. A list of these entities ("List of Members") is available here or from the Data Protection Office. All Fiserv entities can be contacted by email at dpo@fiserv.com. • The UK BCR-Ps apply to in respect of the processing of Personal Data where the Fiserv company acting as a processor has a signed contract with the relevant Data Controller (where the relevant Data Controller may be another Fiserv company or a Third Party Exporter (ie a Fiserv client)) and where there is a transfer of UK personal data by one Fiserv entity (or the Third Party Exporter) to another Fiserv entity located outside of the UK in a country that is not recognised an Adequate Country. • An Adequate Country means a third country, territory, one or more sectors or organisations within a third country, or an international organisation which the Secretary of State has specified by regulations provides an adequate level of protection of personal data in accordance with Section 17A of the Data Protection Act 2018. Currently this list includes Andorra, Argentina, Canada, EEA countries, Gibraltar, Isle of Man, Japan, Jersey, Faroe Islands, Guernsey, New Zealand, Israel, South Korea, US entities that are certified to the UK-US Extension to the EU-US Data Privacy Framework and Uruguay. • Fiserv transfers UK personal data about the following types of data subject: its customers, consumers, merchants, personnel, visitors and suppliers. • Fiserv transfers the following categories of UK personal data: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Employment Data – This includes information relating to a person's current, past or prospective employment or professional experience (e.g. job history and performance evaluations), educational background, qualifications, references, training data, grievances, salary data, benefits information, absence data, background check, survey responses, time and attendance, equal opportunities, monitoring information, dependent and beneficiary information;

<p>The rights of individuals and whose personal data is transferred under the UK BCR-P, including third party beneficiary rights, and the means to exercise those rights</p>	<p>The rights of individuals are as described in the following sections of the EU-BCR-Ps, noting that the rights and exemptions related to data processing that apply to the UK BCRs are to be interpreted in accordance with UK data protection laws (such as the UK GDPR and the UK Data Protection Act 2018, each as may be amended, supplemented or superceded from time to time):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sections 11.21-11.22 with heading: “We respect Data Subject rights as required by applicable Privacy Laws”. • Sections 9.4-9.8 with headings “Third-Party Rights and Enforcement of These Processor Data Protection Standards”, “Rights That are Directly Enforceable Against a Fiserv Processor” and “Rights which are Enforceable Against a Fiserv Processor When the Data Subject Cannot Bring a Claim Against the Data Controller”. <p>Individuals can exercise their rights by contacting the Global Privacy Office using the following link or by contacting Fiserv’s Data Privacy Hotline (+1800-368-1000), or by contacting the Data Protection Officer or Local Privacy Officer (email: dpo@fiserv.com or post: Janus House, Endeavour Drive, Basildon, Essex, SS14 3WF, UK).</p> <p>Fiserv shall respond to such requests within the applicable time period under the UK GDPR, which will typically be one month following the receipt of the request (unless further information is required to identify the information or the processing activities to which a request relates or an exemption applies).</p>	

<p>How individuals and Third Party Exporters can complain to Fiserv Members</p>	<p>Details of how to complain to Fiserv about the BCR (including the UK BCR-P) are as set out in Section 9 of the EU BCR-Ps.</p> <p>Specifically in a UK context, in the event of a dispute, individuals may lodge a complaint about any unlawful or inappropriate processing of their personal data that is incompatible with the UK BCR-P with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fiserv’s Data Privacy Hotline (+1800-368-1000), or by contacting the Data Protection Officer or Local Privacy Officer (email: dpo@fiserv.com or post: Janus House, Endeavour Drive, Basildon, Essex, SS14 3WF, UK). <p>A decision on any complaint made will be communicated to the individual or Third Party Exporter without undue delay and (in any event) within one month of the complaint being made, save that taking into account the complexity and number of complaints, a response may be extended by up to two further months, in which case Fiserv shall inform the individual accordingly.</p> <p>If the individual or Third Party Exporter are not satisfied by the decision, they have the right to lodge a complaint before the ICO and/or the courts of the UK (as set out below).</p>
